HOW WAS YOUR LENT? DID YOU FIND REST? RENEWAL?

OK...here's a test! How many of you realized that on March 3 and March 10 we sang a hymn that was set the same tune but used different words? I did some research this past week and found that same tune was used in two more hymns in The United Methodist Hymnal. If you failed this test, don't worry, I'll give you the background on the tune and the power of these different texts.

In the case of the hymns we sang, the words were put to the tune called BEACH SPRING. The tune name is always located at the bottom right of each hymn. Beach Spring was a tune composed by Benjamin Franklin White in 1844. Benjamin was born in South Carolina. Gifted with musical skills, he came to be known as the "singing master." He was known for using the four-shape system of natation. This powerful and strong tune has different texts written and used by the Methodists in 1961, 1987, 1992, 2006. In addition, there are other versions found in other hymn books.

On page 581 and 605 of our UMH, you'll find "Lord, Whose Love Through Humble Service" and "Wash, O God, Our Sons and Daughters". Both of these hymns use Beach Spring as their melody and use words about renewal, transformation, service, and commitment.

On March 3rd, there was an insert for "When the Hungry Peoples' Chorus" in your bulletin. These words were written in 2006 and found by Pastor Rob to share with congregations from The General Board of Discipleship of the UMC. These words are powerful and hit a homerun for me with the circumstances in the world, our country and in our lives. Here's verse one and three for you to read and absorb its power.

When the hungry peoples' chorus overwhelms us with their cries, when the tasks you set before us make us fearful by their size, teach us. Lord, to pray the harder; help us. Lord to turn anew to the power and heavenly guidance that can only come from you.

Daily schedules get so crowded, we forget we need to pray. Though our judgement's, often clouded, help us. Lord, now, day by day to gain strength by walking near you, and to claim the power of prayer, Help us listen, trust, and hear you, placing all things in your care.

But it was on March 10th, when we sang yet another version from Faith We Sing, that the power of this tune married to the words written in 1992 got woven into Rob's series during Lent... Rest and Retreat. You'll find the three verses for "Come and Find the Quiet Center on page 4. I have printed these words out and have them in view at home to read and reread as I continue with my own Rest and Retreat.

Besides these hymns, I have many take a ways from this year's Lenten Series. Our time in the wilderness is necessary, not only during Lent, but each and everyday. The One Hour Retreat held during March emphasized that rest is more than sleeping. Yes, we do need our physical rest, but we also need mental, emotional, spiritual, social, sensory, and creative rest. Our discussions were based on two books: Sacred Rest by Saundra Dalton-Smith, MD and The Second Mountain by David Brooks. Both books are worth having even if they take you months to read.

Through out this series, I felt pulled to the Psalms. Psalm 37 was used by Felix Mendelssohn in the song O Rest In the Lord, from his oratorio, Elijah. (Oh rest in the Lord, wait patiently for him.) Psalm 121 has always been another favorite of mine, and I was thrilled that Julie Husted used it during her centering thoughts on March 17. (I lift up my eyes to the hillsfrom where will my help come? My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth.) But it was Jeff Bowman who gave me a whole new feeling for Psalm 46:10. He begins every Sunday service the SAME WAY ... with his congregation speaking this verse as a call and response. It becomes very powerful as words are left out on each repeat. Try it!
