Lodged by Robert Frost

The rain to the wind said,
'You push and I'll pelt.'
They so smote the garden bed
That the flowers actually knelt,
And lay lodged--though not dead.
I know how the flowers felt.

I am enamored by this Robert Frost poem. I often wonder how many people I see every day know how those flowers felt. How do they get along being pelted and pushed. I wonder too how the poet himself mitigated life's daily pelting and pushing. I want to tell everyone who find themselves in that assaulted and smitten garden bed something I learned from a Missouri pastor. His name is Adam Hamilton. He wrote a book a few years ago titled *WHY?*. Adam is an United Methodist Pastor at the Church of the Resurrection in Leawood - Kansas City. Our pastor, Rob Cook has recently accessed Reverend Hamilton's recorded wisdom in helping our congregation mitigate some the questions connected to the future of our denomination of Christians known as the United Methodist Church. The book *WHY?* invites the reader to engage with a handful of topics surrounding questions of theodicy – (God's will – "Why do bad things happen to good people?") and questions that plague all of us from time to time; questions of disappointment, fear, anxiety, depression, and anger. A take away from the book that has been helpful and one that has stuck with me for the past few years is this: (not a direct quote, but something that I assimilated)

'The worst thing that could ever happen is not the last thing that will happen.'

For a large part of my life, I was involved in helping my employers avoid the consequences of unwanted and unplanned events (accidents and injury). We put policies and procedures in place that we hoped would reduce the risk of doing harm to ourselves and others. The practice of carrying out these plans determined the success or failure of our efforts. The plan always was to end the day with quality and profit; however, as many of you know, "things" happen.

We do not live in a perfect world. Our expectations aren't always met. It seems that our hopes and dreams often remain unfulfilled. And when I find myself staring into the face of such negativity; perhaps uncertain as to how to press on through a 'dark-night-of-the-soul experience; when these days are upon me, I long to gather around the campfire and warm my knees with people who know the stories of God, people who have been pelted and smitten, people who hear that voice that says: "Be not afraid." And "In this world you will have trouble, but, take heart; I have overcome the world."

So, I pray the prayer the disciples asked for: "Our Father..." And, I go to sleep and rise in the hope and promise of God's abiding love.





WHY? by Adam Hamilton



Did Bill tweak your interest in wanting to read **Why?** by Adam Hamilton? Here is a book review for this 99 page book. Perhaps you will want to order it from Amazon.

Where is God when tragedy and suffering strike?

When the ground shakes, and a poor nation's economy is destroyed; when the waters rise, washing away a community's hopes and dreams; when a child suffers neglect and abuse; when violence tears apart nations; where is God? If God is all powerful, and if each one of us is a beloved child of God, then

how can God allow tragedy and suffering to infest his creation? In *Why?*, best-selling author Adam Hamilton brings fresh insight to the age-old question of how to understand the will of God. Rejecting simplistic answers and unexamined assumptions, he lays out core ideas for comprehending God's plan for the world, God will not take away our free will, even when we use it to grieve him. God will never abandon us, especially in the midst of our suffering. While God is not the author of suffering, God will bring blessing out of tragedy.

What a confirmation about our mission statement: "Creating safe spaces for growth and community in Christ."

Are you listening? Can you see what the spirit is doing at The Corner?
