I Am the Church — You Are the Church — We Are the Church TOGETHER ~Juanita Joiner



Lent is a time for introspection and self-reflection, encouraging Christians to ask themselves questions about their faith, actions, and relationship with God, aiming for spiritual growth and renewal. And Lent at Central was exactly that! It was filled with questions! Bishop David Bard started us out with this question on Ash Wednesday: *Tell me, what is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?* Pastor Rob's entire Lenten Series was entitled: *How is it with your soul?* Even Rob's sermon title on April 6 was a question: *What Do You Want Me to Do For You?* When I was a little girl I disliked all the questions my Mother would keep asking: *Where have you been? How was school today? Why did you do that?* I'm sure you will agree that questions are important in our lives. Questions make us think, search and hopefully, find!

There is one question I've been asked over and over these past few months by people in this church: *How is the banner coming? When will it be finished?* Well, for those of you who have asked...I have an answer for you. It is finished! Yes, FINISHED!

Just like any journey we take in life, it took loads of time, tons of energy and every bit of strength I could muster to reach the finish line. Was it worth it? (Sorry, another question.) Without blinking an eye or questioning my answer I will give you a resounding, YES!

We Are the Church is a "one of a kind" banner...never to be duplicated! It has a story to tell and if you bear with me, I'll share some of this journey with each of you now...how I took the words I am the church, You are the church, WE are the church TOGETHER and by pouring your love and our ancestor's love into hundreds of hours, I was able to make a banner that was handstitched from beginning to end using these four words as my motivation: faith, hope, love and joy. These four words have served as the foundation for our church from 1856 to 2025. (And I believe will be in the future.) If my calculator is correct, that's 169 years! What a history we have had in those 169 years. Not all were without people asking a simple question... "What are we going to do?" If you read the wonderful book, The Builders...The Identity and Witness of Central United Methodist Church of Muskegon, Michigan by Thomas F. Begley, you'll know why that simple question was asked so many times and why during the past 169 years we as a church have relied on our faith, our love, our hope and yes...even celebrating our joy to survive! That's right. Survive!

It would have been so easy to have given up with all the devastating events that happened...the many times people were digging in their pockets for a penny or two to keep things afloat. Not only were there financial problems that would rock the city and country, they also rocked our existing building during the Great Depression. And what about our history of always doing and giving to our community? Always being there for others even when we were struggling. What made that possible? It was our ancestors FAITH, HOPE, LOVE and JOY that filled every part of their mind, body, and soul. I like to think that those four words have been permanently cemented into the foundation of this church. I love that verse in Matthew 16:18 when Jesus declares to Peter... "on this rock I will build my church." The phrase "upon this rock I will build my church" signifies that the church will be built on a solid foundation, a foundation that will withstand any opposition. I also placed each piece of fabric shared with me on another piece of fabric to represent that solid foundation. Hymns like How Firm a Foundation, The Church's One Foundation, Great Is Thy Faithfulness have been sewn deeply into the fabric. Scriptures like Philippians 4:4-7 and Psalm 46 have also been lovingly stitched into the fabric. And to finish it off, I sewed on the binding while singing these words: "Blest be the tie that binds our hearts in Christian love". Yes, 169 years of love!

I not only felt the words from hymns and scripture, but I felt your loving stories about your fabric. I held fabric that was used to make a dress for a daughter's doll, fabric used to create a last quilt at the age of 101+, fabric that was from a dress worn for a Daddy Daughter Dance at school, fabric that declared your faith, fabric that would honor someone special or your time spent in the military, and even fabric for a Contemplative Prayer project at Central. Thank you for giving me the honor to take your *I am and You are* fabric and make it into our beautiful **We Are the Church Together** banner. I felt so much love as I stitched during these past months. In fact, I was sad to see the end when I snipped that last thread.

So, when do you get to see the banner and hear the "rest of the story"? I'm only going to say this: it will be one Sunday in May! Just make sure you attend each week during May. Until then...

I am the church! You are the church! We are the church together!
All who follow Jesus, all around the world!
