Annual Church Conference Report

Dear Church, from May 30th – June 1st we attended the annual conference in Acme Mi. by Traverse City. Here is a summary report. We had a wonderful time seeing the "Unfinished UMC," catching up with friends, and meeting new friends.

Constitutional Amendments for changes to the Book of Discipline

These proposals have the support of the General Conference, the Council of Bishops, the Michigan Conference General Conference Delegation, the Connectional Table and others.

- 1. A set of amendments to create new regional conferences that will each have equal power to adapt portions of the Book of Discipline within their prospective regions. The United States would become its own Regional Conference, allowing it to make decisions that specifically address outreach and ministry needs within the U.S. context.
- 2. An amendment to add the words "gender" and "ability" to Paragraph 4, Article 4 of the constitution to categories that cannot be used to exclude membership in The United Methodist Church.
- 3. Updating an amendment to strengthen Article V of the UMC Constitution by explicitly recognizing the church's role in combating racism, racial inequity, colonialism, white privilege, and white supremacy.
- 4. General Conference voted to amend Section VI, Article IV of the United Methodist Constitution, which establishes the educational requirements for clergy members of annual or provisional conferences who are eligible to vote for clergy delegates to the General Conference.

Resolutions

- 1. The 2025 budget for the Michigan UMC Conference was decreased by 5.2% and the Benefits budget was also decreased by 4%, both from the prior year.
- 2. Resolutions on past service rate, housing and rental allowance for retired or clergy on disability, and equitable compensation schedule all passed.
- 3. A continuation of our commitment was made to the people of Haiti through our long history with our Haitian partners.
- 4. Mandatory Protection Policy and Ethics training for clergy was passed.
- 5. A resolution Calling for Two States: Israel and Palestine was passed.
- 6. Holy Land Excursion boycott was passed.
- 7. A boycott against Chevron's oil and gas production in Israel passed.

HYMNS, WORDS, AND PRAYERS

On June 8th, the power of words filled our service. Words that we sang, words that were read/spoken, and words that were prayed. There's power in words.

Our second hymn was a tune that was very familiar. It was based on a beautiful American folksong known as "O Waly, Waly." Hal Hopson wrote the version found in the UMH called, *Gift of Love*. The third verse is a call to each of us: *Come, Spirit, come, our hearts control, our spirits long to be made whole.* Let inward love guide every need; by this we worship and are freed. But the words we sang that Sunday were written in 2005...words that also speak loud and clear with that beautiful American folk song: May God the Father, God the Son, and God the Spirit make us one. In holiness let us unite that we may know the risen Christ."

The closing words from Pastor Rob's sermon only solidified the words we had already sung: Despite all that divides us and all that tears our world apart, we are God's people. God uses our differences to create new life again and again and again. So, let that be our prayer on this Pentecost Sunday. Not that God will make us all the same, but that God will continue to make us different. Life in all its forms gives glory to one God and one Creator. Life in all its glory is meant to be one...Amen

Finally, the prayer that Diane VanWesep shared truly bound us together in Christian love. Her well thought out words were unforgettable ... "O Lord, we ask you to hear these our prayers for members of our extended church family. But we know that you expect us to be your ambassadors to many outside of our immediate circle. So, we pray for those in our community who are experiencing food and/or housing insecurity. We pray for the institutions trying to provide them with meals and shelter. But, more than that, O Lord, we ask you to show us how we can help. We can feel so helpless when faced with hurting people standing on street corners with their cardboard signs bearing black marker pleas for help. Grant us the wisdom, the courage, and the empathy with which to decide on the most Christ-like response.

And we pray for our country, O Lord. There is so much divisiveness, separation and rancor...when compromise and bridge-building and kindness are so badly needed. Please open our ears and our hearts to listen to the opinions of those with whom we disagree. And, when we open our mouths to speak, may we be motivated by the desire to find common ground...even when that means agreeing to disagree. Help us remember that just as a forest is healthier and stronger when it possesses many different species of trees, so too are we as a society healthier and stronger when we possess persons from many different ethnicities and cultures and religions and gender identities.

And we pray for our world, knowing that you hold the whole world in your hand. We grieve for the people in Ukraine as the war with Russia goes on and the number of the dead increases. We weep for the people in Gaza as the Israeli/Palestinian conflict rages and people are not only killed in battle, but die of starvation or while trying to get food. O Spirit of the Living God, fall afresh on the leaders of those countries as well as ours and guide them to find solutions that honor all sides and lead to lasting peace with dignity.

Indeed, Spirit of the Living God, fall afresh on all of us. Melt us, mold us, fill us and use us to further the coming of your kingdom." Amen

O breath of God, come fill this place; revive our hearts to know your grace; and from our slumber make us rise that we may know the risen Christ.
