Are We Flying in "V" Formation?

I recently had lunch with a former student. Because I taught music, I had most students for up to eight years and therefore, I've always had a long-lasting relationship with them. After we caught up with family and yes, even grandchildren, out of the blue she said this... "Do you remember *The Goose Story* you always told us at the beginning of each year and how we had the class motto, *I Can, We Can, We Will?*" This caught me off guard but at the same time, I found this touching that after all these years, she still remembered how I started each year. However, it was her next comment that brought *tears to my eyes...*"Mrs. Joiner, I always told my own children that same story before they started each school year and now, I am telling it to my grandchildren." WOW...I'm one proud retired teacher.

This year, The Goose Story spoke to me in a different way...instead of students, I had in view our church and the direction Pastor Rob and the Church Council is leading us. After you read this story, I think you will agree that the direction we are heading is not only being led by Rob and the Council, but there is a need for each and EVERYONE of us to find our place in that "V" formation. **WE are definitely that flock of geese.** Here's that story.

"This Fall, when you see geese heading south for the winter, flying along in a V formation, you might consider what science has discovered as to why they fly that way. As each bird flaps its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird immediately following it. By flying in a V formation, the whole flock adds at least 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew on its own. **People who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going more quickly and easily, because they are traveling on the thrusts of one another.**

When a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to go it alone. It quickly gets back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird in front of it. If we have as much sense as a goose, we will stay in formation with those who are headed the same way we are.

When the lead goose gets tired, it rotates back in the wing and another goose takes over that point position. **It pays to take turns doing hard jobs.**

Geese honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed. An encouraging word goes a long way.

Finally, when a goose gets sick, or is wounded by gunshots and falls out, two other geese fall out with that goose and follow it down to help and protect it. They stay until the fallen goose can fly or until it dies, and only then do they launch out on their own or with another formation to catch up with their group. **If we have the sense of a goose, we will stand by each other like that.** " Author Unknown

Mary Oakes had no idea that she actually gave proof to the above story with her Centering Thoughts on September 17th. CUMC was that flock of geese for Peter and Mary. That was true for them and still true NOW! Here's her story!

"Peter and I came to Central United Methodist Church in January of 1986 looking for a church that would accept us and our understanding of God, Christ, and the love we were taught early in our faith journey. The night before that Sunday in January, Peter said to me, "Tomorrow, I'm going down to Central. I've been hearing good things from Jerry Bruining and I want to see for myself. If you don't want to come—that's OK—but I just have to go." So, early Sunday morning we trundled on down to attend the 8:30 a.m. Chapel Service hoping we could simply sneak in and slip out. We just wanted to get an idea of the church. Much to our surprise, when we walked in the doors of the Narthex, we were made very aware that the Holy Spirit was bouncing off the walls. And that was a warm and wonderful feeling. Then we went into the Chapel expecting ten or twelve people but found it very well attended. In fact, we had to sit down in front in order to find a seat! We settled down to sing and pray and hear a God directed sermon. **WE WERE HOME**. We stayed because of the depth of those who were worshiping at Central. We found that they have a deep awareness of God and Christ in their lives helping us to grow spiritually, and we found a deep love that they hold in their hearts. The love which causes them to share their love with others." (Editor's Note: And just like that, Peter and Mary became a part of that "V" formation...thank you Central!)

Why don't you spend time with the banner in the Narthex this month. Find your spot on a branch. (It's V shaped) "Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing." John 15:4-5
